A fun and easy way to record and store information for your nonfiction studies!

What is a Fact File?

A **Fact File** is a student-generated resource used to record and store information about a particular topic, using the guidance of the templates included within.

Each **Fact File** contains the following elements to help guide the student's exploration and study of a particular topic:

- *What do you know about..* web (complete before study formally begins)
- *Questions I Have About..* template (complete before and during study)
- Fact Cards + Fact Card Pocket
- Sticky Note Spot
- Vocabulary Envelope
- Directed List space
- Diagram drawing spot
- Collection Pocket

MATERIALS (per student):

- included templates
- file folder (11.5"x8.5" or larger)
- envelope (4 1/8" x 9.5")
- 5-10 sticky notes
- scissors
- glue

Front Cover



Each front cover is designed to include the title, name plate, and a place where the student can complete a web about the information he already knows about the topic he is studying. Of course, let your kiddos personalize these as much as possible by adding color and drawings to the unused space!

Inside Left



Use this space to record questions (before study) and answers (during study).

This is a place to store sticky notes for use during reading and research. Use them to flag important information, jot a quick note, or record something you don't want to forget!

Glue only the left, bottom, and right outer edge to make this pocket. Then, insert the fact cards inside for easy access and storage.

Inside Right



Glue an envelope to folder as pictured above. Label it with the vocabulary label. Insert term/definition cards inside for easy access and storage.

Make a list based on the given topic (varies depending on topic of study).

Back Cover



This space is used to diagram the given topic or something associated with the given topic.

Glue the left, bottom, and right outer edge to make this pocket. It can be used to hold used sticky notes, photographs, pictures, or miscellaneous papers.
